

received from the Mary Sumner House:

The Diocese of Durgapur is a diocese in the Church of North India [CNI], located within the West Bengal State of India. The Church of North India was inaugurated in September 1970 and is an ecumenical Church uniting the Anglican, Methodist, Congregational, Presbyterian, and Reformed churches. The Women's Fellowship for Christian Service in the Church of North India are affiliated to the global Mothers' Union.

The Women's Fellowship run projects to help address the issues faced in the area, and is very passionate about ministry to the sick, broken families, the elderly, and raising children in Christian teaching.

Members of the Women's Fellowship in Durgapur have been particularly involved in various development initiatives aimed at supporting members of the community who have traditionally been neglected or marginalised, seeking to provide them with lives of dignity and sustainability. For example, the Diocesan Women's Fellowship has extended its ministry to serving children from slum areas who are otherwise neglected and prone to abuse. They are providing training in the empowerment of women to help the women earn an income to support their family, and new schools have been opened giving the children a chance to receive an education.

Through their programmes and activities, the Women's Fellowship is also committed to working to address gender inequality in India.

As we light a candle and give thanks for the Christian witness by Mothers' Union members from Khartoum, please read and take time to reflect on the information

received from the Mary Sumner House:

Following the independence of South Sudan from Sudan in 2011, the Province of the Episcopal Church of Sudan decided in 2013 that it wanted to remain as one Church despite the split into two separate countries; and created an internal province for the dioceses in Sudan. At All Saints Cathedral in Khartoum up to 10,000 worshipers saw the Most Revd Ezekiel Kumir Kondo, Bishop of Khartoum, enthroned as the first Archbishop of the new internal province of Sudan.

The key focus of the Mothers' Union today is prayer, and working for peace and unity, praying for all in an interfaith environment. Mothers' Union has its own provincial days of prayer, diocesan days of prayer, home fellowships, peace prayers and inter-faith prayers. In the annual House of Bishop's Meeting in 2015 there was agreement that all the people spoke with one voice about peace, committing themselves to encouraging those at grass-roots level to become peace-builders and peace makers.

Archdeacon of Coventry and their Chair of the Sudan Church Association Michael Paget Wilkes, travelled to take a cross of nails from Coventry to All Saints Cathedral, Khartoum. Michael said: I am hoping that once the connection has been made then contacts of prayer will automatically spring up between Khartoum and other praying groups.

Mothers Union members reach out into the community to women of all faiths and none using the tools of the Mothers' Union Literacy and Financial Education Programme to visibly show their love to all, empowering women and often men to find support and love in their groups together.

Reida, Mothers' Union Community Development Coordinator in Khartoum, said "we have [literacy] centres that have both Muslims and Christians working together as one. They now share their ideas together, solve their problems together, as in previous contact this close working relationship was not evident. This unity has happened after a long struggle and now they are happily working together ".

Throughout Gloucestershire within our Deaneries many members belong to Branches which meet on a regular basis and bring a variety of practical help and support to their parish and community. Our membership to the Mothers' Union is also founded on prayer and fellowship, with fun being an important item on the agenda.

Here in the Diocese of Gloucester, through prayer, policy and practical action, our members engage at grassroots level to demonstrate our Christian faith – working towards transformation of our communities – both locally and globally to encourage the nurture of the family in its many forms and translating into daily life the three petitions contained within the Magnificat – working towards moral, social and economic justice for all.

<u>Prayer</u>: offering Rainbow Prayer Day resources – with opportunity to take time to reflect on the impact of domestic violence and other gender–based issues within society; and also holding monthly Midday Prayers in Gloucester Cathedral.

The Diocese of Dar es Salaam covers a large area, encompassing the whole of the Dar es Salaam region, the Coastal region, and parts of the Tanga, Morogoro and Lindi regions. The diocese also includes Mafia Island.

Dar es Salaam city is the hub of the country's economy, and attracts many people from different part of Tanzania and abroad to settle here. This brings a wealth of different cultures, traditions, languages and income to the area.

There are more than 7,900 Mothers' Union members in Dar es Salaam and this number continues to grow each year.

Mothers' Union activities in **Dar es Salaam** include:

- Visits to children and adults in hospital to offer food and toiletries
- ∀ Visits to orphans and widows to offer food, clothes, soap and mosquito nets
- Visits to Nursery Schools to offer food and stationery supplies
- Seminars/workshops on different topics including entrepreneurship, gender equality, Christendom, leadership and health education on HIV/AIDs
- Contributing to building new Churches, and purchasing of benches and chairs for these Churches.
- Formation of savings and credit unions
- Drilling water wells to enable families to have access to clean water
- Encouraging the Community to apprehend and know the rights of children.
- Members have started building a Girls Hostel
- Working with the youth within the Church and in the wider community

The Diocese of Bari is located in northern Nigeria. It was officially inaugurated in May 2008 as a missionary diocese within the Church of Nigeria. The Anglican Cathedral Church of St Paul is in Gidan Mato, Bari.

Mothers' Union members in Nigeria support families in a variety of different ways including vocational training, marriage counselling and parenting skills support.

Activities in Niger West include Bible study, prayer and fellowship meetings, evangelism, income generating activities, skills development and outreach to the vulnerable and needy.

Mothers' Union in Bari also work very closely with the Women's Guild and Girls' Guild.
