Mary Sumner Prayer

All this day, O Lord, let me touch as many lives as possible for thee; and every life I touch, do thou by this spirit quicken, whether through the word I speak, the prayer I breathe, or the life I live. **Amen**

Setting: Table with a cloth, MU motif & candle: members seated in surrounding circle (if possible); A vase of flowers; sufficient copies of Bibles; Hymn books/sheets; a tray with six night lights; matches.

Introduction: Women everywhere - North, South, East, West face many of the same burdens: Inequality; Gender-based violence (including FGM); Modern-day slavery; War and Displacement; Climate change; Poverty. Mothers' Union, working together across the world seeks to address these with compassion and justice, whilst celebrating with joy and love: Equality; Freedom; Peace and Harmony; Families and Service.

If no music available hymns may be sung unaccompanied or read either in unison or antiphonally.

The Psalms may be similarly read; or to suit your situation.

Readings: Exodus 2: 1-10. John 4:1-30. Matthew 15:30-31. John 2: 1-11. Luke 10:30-37 Luke 15:11-32 Matthew 13:3-9 1 Corinthians 13:1-8a

Psalms: 113. 119:169 - 176. 67. 25:1 - 7

Hymns: Be still in the presence of the Lord.
To God be the Glory
Love Divine, all loves excelling.
When I needed a neighbour
To Thee O Lord our hearts we raise
Brother, sister, let me serve you.

**After the lighting of each candle allow a few moments of silence.

It is intended that each section to be approximately 10 minutes. It is possible to shorten or lengthen this, depending on your situation, by omitting hymns or prayers, or by adding ones from the additions in the back cover or your own particular favourites.

Leader: The world belongs to God. **All:** The Earth and all its people.

Leader: How good it is, how wonderful.

All: To live together in unity.

Leader: Love and faith come together.

All: Justice and Peace join hands.

Leader: We, in the Diocese of Gloucester, join with our sisters and brothers in Bari & Ilesa, Nigeria: Dar es Salaam, Tanzania: Durgapur, North India: Khartoum, Sudan & South Sudan.

All: The Lord's Prayer.

Hymn: Be still in the presence of the Lord.

Reading: Exodus 2: 1 - 10. Moses

Leader: We give thanks for the countless number of un-named, anonymous women, like the mother of Moses, who, over the centuries, have nourished and protected their children; who work tirelessly so that they may grow up and flourish.

Psalm: 113.

Praise the Lord, ye servants: O praise the name of the Lord. Blessed be the name of the Lord: from this time forth for evermore. The Lord's name is praised: from the rising up of the sun unto the going down of the same.

The Lord is high above all heathen: and his glory above the heavens. Who is like unto the Lord our God, that hath his dwelling so high: and yet humbleth himself to behold the things that are in heaven and earth? He taketh up the simple out of the dust: and lifteth the poor out of the mire;

That he may set him with the princes: even with the princes of his people.

He maketh the barren women to keep house: and to be a joyful mother of children.

All: Living Father, we thank you for our mothers. Help us to share your love and compassion with families everywhere. Amen.

As we light a candle, we give thanks for mothers everywhere.

Reading: John 4: 1-30. The Woman at the well

Leader: Jesus challenged many social customs. He demonstrates to us that this woman is created and loved by God; He does not treat her as an outcast, nor condemns her, but meets her in her need and gives her life.

Reading: Matthew 15:30-31

Leader: We pray that governments will recognise that disabled people are also affected by domestic abuse and ensure that legislation is so worded to be inclusive.

All: 'Nobody cares what happens.... the neighbours know but they act like nothing is going on.... how can they hear it and pretend like they don't.... they're just as bad as him... they could do something, but they don't'.

Leader: We ask for strength to Listen, Observe and Act when we fear that anyone, particularly a child, is in danger.

All: God give us insight to recognise violence in all its forms and courage to name it, speaking out for justice. We ask for compassion for the vulnerable and grace and strength to stand with them. Send your Holy Spirit to bless us with a prayerful heart, and power to breathe peace, transforming the world. Amen.

Leader: Love matters. Our love for God motivates and challenges us to keep this command: 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind: and your neighbour as yourself.' (*Luke 10:27*).

Psalm: 119: 169-176.

Let my cry reach you, O God; that I may understand your word.

Let my pleading reach you; that I may be saved by your promise.

Let my lips proclaim your praise, for you teach me your statutes.

Let my tongue sing your praises, for your laws are justice itself.

Let your hand be ready to help me: I have chosen your precepts.

I long for your salvation, O God: your law is my delight.

Let me live to praise you; let your decrees be my help.

I have strayed like a lost sheep, but have not forgotten your laws.

Come, seek out your servant.

Hymn: To God be the glory!

As we light a candle, we pray for an end to all violence and abuse.

Reading: John 2:1 – 11. The Wedding at Cana

Leader: If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal, and if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give away all I have and if I deliver my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing. Love is patient and kind; love is not jealous or boastful; it is not arrogant or rude. Love does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrong, but rejoices in the right. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. (1 Corinthians 13:1-8a)

Reader: Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who gave marriage to be a source of blessing to mankind, we thank you for the joys of family life. May we know your presence and peace in our homes; fill them with your love, and use them for your glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Psalm 67

God be merciful unto us and bless us: and make his face shine upon us, That your ways may be known on earth: your saving power among all nations.

Let the people praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you. Let the nations be glad and sing: for you judge the peoples with integrity and govern the nations upon earth.

Let the peoples praise you O God: let all the peoples praise you.

Then the earth will yield its fruitfulness: and God our God, will bless us.

God shall bless us: and all the ends of the world shall fear him.

Hymn: Love Divine all loves excelling.

As we light a candle, we give You thanks and we pray for all those who have entered into marriage; engaged couples; those contemplating marriage and those in long-term, loving relationships.

Reading: Luke 10: 30-37. The Good Samaritan

Leader: Lord God, help us to love one another because of our differences, not despite them, and to rejoice in each person's individual part of the whole picture. Help us to grow and work together, spurring one another on towards love and good deeds so that your will, not ours, will be done, and your kingdom will come in this place. **Amen.**

Psalm: 25: 1 − 7

To thee, O Lord, I lift up my soul. Oh my God in thee I trust, let me not be put to shame; let not my enemies exault over me.

Let none that wait for thee be put to shame;

Let them be ashamed who are wantonly treacherous.

Make me to know thy ways, O Lord; teach me thy paths.

Lead me in thy truth and teach me, for thou art the God of my salvation; for thee I wait all the day long.

Be mindful of thy mercy, O Lord, and of thy steadfast love, for they have been from of old.

Remember not the sins of my youth, or my transgressions; according to thy steadfast love remember me, for thy goodness' sake, O Lord!

Hymn: When I needed a neighbour.

As we light a candle, we pray for travellers; refugees and those fleeing war and violence: we give thanks for all those who help, support and care for them.

Reading: Matthew 13:3 – 9. The Parable of the Sower

Leader: Eternal God, you crown the year with your goodness and you give us the fruits of the earth in their season: grant that we may use them to your glory, for the relief of those in need and for our own well-being; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Reader: God of all grace, your Son Jesus Christ fed the hungry with the bread of his life and the word of his kingdom: renew your people with your heavenly grace and in all our weakness sustain us by your true and living bread; who is alive and reigns, now and for ever. **Amen**

Hymn: To thee, O Lord, our hearts we raise

All: Blessed Lord, who caused all holy scriptures to be written for our learning: help us so to hear them, to read, mark learn and inwardly digest them that, through patience, and the comfort of your holy word, we may embrace and for ever hold fast the hope of everlasting life, which you have given us in our Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Reader: Across the world those who have so much must give to those who have so little. What does it cost? A compassionate heart; a pair of hands; a little time.

With hands and hearts let us stop world poverty; let us stop world hunger; let us stop world GREED. United by one voice, we speak out against the power of unequal wealth, and crime of ignorance and the shame of world exploitation. **Amen.**

Leader: While on earth, Jesus championed the cause of the poor, vulnerable and marginalised. When Jesus ascended into heaven he passed this work onto us (*John 14:12*) in sending the Holy Spirit he gave the spiritual resources to carry it out. This gift, which turned weak and fearful disciples into those who acted with boldness throughout the known world, is freely available to us. As we pray and work for justice and mercy, we know that we have been commissioned by Christ who is continually interceding for us; and we have the power of the Spirit in all our endeavours.

As we light a candle, we pray for Good stewardship of the World's resources and the abolition of Poverty, Hunger, and GREED.

As we light a candle we pray for ourselves: for Mothers' Union members here in Gloucestershire and in our Link Dioceses of Bari & Ilesa; Dar es Salaam; Durgapur: Khartoum. and for our families and friends.

Reading: Luke 15:11 – 32 The Prodigal

Leader: Father of all, we give you thanks and praise, that when we were still far off you met us in your Son and brought us home.

Dying and living, he declared your love, gave us grace and opened the gate of glory. May we who share Christ's body, live his risen life; we who drink his cup bring life to others; we whom the Spirit lights give light to the world so that we and all your children shall be free and the whole earth live to praise your name, through Christ our Lord. **Amen**

All: The Mothers' Union Prayer

<u>Reader:</u> Make me a builder of bridges, Lord! Help me to listen more and talk less; to learn rather than give advice; to receive when I would rather give; to acknowledge that I do not have all the truth; to face rejection with with humility; and ever more deeply to go on loving in Jesus' name
